His Excellency, The Most Reverend Douglas Crosby, Bishop of Hamilton, and Ms. Anita Chiu, Director, People and Culture, Ontario Association of Children's Aid Societies provided greetings to the assembly.

8.0 REMARKS FROM THE BOARD CHAIR

The Board Chair spoke to the success at the agency in maintaining the momentum of the strategic plan while coping with the demands of the pandemic.

The Board Chair spoke about the numerous accomplishments during the past year in moving the agency's mission forward while keeping the children, youth, and families it serves as the focus of the decisions and providing them with high quality, holistic, and strength-based services, founded on Catholic teachings, and evolution through a lens of equality, diversity, and inclusivity.

The Board Chair stated the Board continues to support the agency in addressing the long-standing issues of over-representation of Black and Indigenous children and youth in the child welfare sector inclusive of this Society. The Board has instituted regular reviews of race-based data and approved an *Equity Statement*; both of which will be shared with the community. As well, the Society had become an inclusive agency recognizing the needs of the LGBTQ2S+ community.

In conclusion, the Board Chair recognized fellow Board members, staff, foster and kin caregivers, volunteers, donors, and senior staff of the organization for the professional and collaborative approach in serving the needs of the children, youth, and families. He made special mention to Mr. Rocco Gizzarelli, Executive Director as Rocco retires at the end of June. The Chair thanked Rocco Gizzarelli for his years of

service to the agency and community as well as highlighted his many successes as the Executive Director.

9.0 REPORT OF THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

The Executive Director reported that the Catholic Children's Aid Society of Hamilton continues to be inspired by its vision statement – *Child and youth safety, well-being, and resilience. Thriving families. Community partners working together.*

The Executive Director highlighted some the agency's key accomplishments of the past year:

- To address issues of food insecurity, the Society partnered with Goodwill to provide meals to youth and support the families it serves struggling through the pandemic over a 26-week period. With the help of Hamilton Taste Buds, children who would normally receive meals at school, could now receive meals at home.
- Youth Support workers delivered meals on a weekly basis to our youth living independently who were no longer able to access meals at the Youth Drop-In Program at the Society due to the pandemic. Children and families attending the office for visits and appointments were offered meals to enjoy while in the office and/or take home for the remainder of the week. Service recipients struggling to feed themselves and their children noted that the support alleviated stress and worry.
- Providing children and youth with computers and Internet access to attend school virtually.
- Our foster families and volunteers made sure children and youth were safe, well and remained connected to their families, schools, and community, despite the many obstacles COVID-19 created.
- Together with Shalem Mental Health Network and the WrapAround program, the Society supported children in their homes wrapping supports around the children and their families. This strength-based community focused program allows for the family to find support from their community and familiarity with the services they receive, minimizing the intrusion as they heal and grow together.
- Maintained prudent fiscal management of the Society's resources and being proactive on grant applications that support initiatives that enhance service delivery.

- The Society changed its recruitment and hiring practices, amended policies, advocated for Bill C-6 (an Act that would ban activities related to conversion therapy) and worked alongside others in the community on anti-racism.
- The completion of an equity audit.
- The deepening of a sustainable healthy working culture within the Catholic Children's Aid Society of Hamilton that will increase job satisfaction, decrease absenteeism, and support overall wellness – particularly as COVID becomes the new normal.
- Implementation of data driven decision making that encourages staff to have integrated data quality and evidence-based research embedded in their practice.

The Executive Director reiterated the Society will continue to put children and youth at the centre of decision making, ensure services are more inclusive and culturally appropriate, and support better outcomes for First Nations, Inuit and Métis, Black and African Canadian, and racialized children and youth in the community.

As this was the last AGM for the Executive Director, Mr. Gizzarelli recognized and expressed immense gratitude to the generous donors, all staff, foster, kin, and adoptive families, and volunteers. He acknowledged the strong and committed Board of Directors; His Excellency Bishop Crosby for his guidance and enduring support; the support of the Ministry of Children, Community and Social Services, and the agency's Senior Leadership Team, Ms. Kristin Prince, Executive Assistant, and former Executive Assistant Gail Gray who recently retired, and the community partners.

10.0 REPORT OF THE TREASURER

10.1 <u>Presentation of Audited Financial Statements and Report of the Auditors for the Year</u> Ended March 31, 2022

The financial audit was conducted by the firm of HGK Partners LLP in accordance with Canadian generally accepted auditing standards.

Father David Wilhelm, Board Treasurer advised that a copy of the Audited Financial Statements, together with the Auditor's Report for the year ended March 31, 2022 were received by the Members. The Audit and Finance Committee of the Board met with the team from HGK Partners to review the financial statements and audit findings report in detail on May 25, 2022. The audited Financial Statements F2022 were approved at the Board Meeting on May 30, 2022.
